# About the report

The statistical part of the ADC Report contains a detailed presentation of all of Austria's Official Development Assistance (ODA).

It is a reference work offering a comprehensive review of the origins, composition, volume and use of Austrian ODA.

The statistics are based on the definitions and directives of the OECD Development Assistance Committee (DAC) for describing official development assistance, which are designed in particular to establish an internationally comparable basis for determining whether and to what extent goals are being met.


The structure of the report goes from a general presentation of the two main components "multilateral ODA" and "bilateral ODA" to a special section devoted to the special features of the period under review. Section III.1 is devoted in particular to the bilateral programme of Austrian Development Cooperation and Cooperation with Eastern Europe (ADC) implemented by the Austrian Development Agency (ADA).

To set the detailed results regarding the period under review in a longer-term context, the detailed figures for 2004 and 2005 are preceded by longer time series.

Part I of the ADC Report is devoted to the thematic priorities that ADC is currently involved in. ADC concentrates on specific themes and sectors so as to improve the efficiency of the resources used. Complementarity and coherence with other international donors is of increasing importance in this respect.




#### Main components of Austrian ODA 2005





The slightly imprecise DAC directives were interpreted in various ways by the Member States, which means that the data cannot be compared. The decision cleared up this situation and also determined that this ODA coefficient would be subject to an annual review.
